Doug Hecker's 1965 455 Powered Gran Sport

Like most of us car guys Doug always was interested in cars with a SS 396 four speed and a 1969 Pontiac Gran Prix that he was hot rodding when the hype on the race of the Stage1 versus Hemi shoot out in the 80s caught his attention. Having attention tweaked started researching this engine.

Doug's first Buick was a 1970 Skylark Convertible, with a 350 engine it was not a healthy as it should be so Engie Bauza in Pennsylvania was sought for an upgrade and a beefed up 455 and four speed was installed. It touned out Engie sold the 350 engine with the new owner discovering three wiped cam lobes with one being a perfect round circle, explaining the lackluster performance of the pulled engine. Obviously they made good on the sold Buick 350 engine.

At 23 years of age Engie talked Doug into going to Englishtown. Doug's first run with the torque and four speed transmission on Radial TA tires yielded a very smoky run with the car fishtailing one way through first gear, the other way through second gear and again the original way through third gear. This spectacular run yielded a mid 15 second run. Doug was hooked on that memorial run, and became a regular at Englishtown with slicks added a few weeks later and a roll cage shortly thereafter.

Twenty five years ago Doug started looking for a race car as the convertible was not fitting the bill. From attendance at Northeast Chapter Buick events he decided there were enough 70 through 72 Gran Sports out there racing, so was looking for a 1965 Skylark or GS.

Continued from Page 1 A decent 1965 Skylark was found in Kentucky earlier, but it was already sold. Engie found a rusty 1965 Gran Sport with a 401 for \$275. This car needed a trunk floor, lower quarters and wheel well work that was completed in the process of putting together. The restoration included installing a roll cage, back-halving the car, adding a Ford nine inch differential with a healthy 455 Stage 1 and fresh turbo 400. Doug got a good deal as Engie indicated he could not charge for all the hours to set up the back-halved car settling for \$800, and this would be his first and last one completed. Several years Rick Martinez paid \$3000 for the same work.

Doug and Rick Martinez were the first North East Chapter representatives to go to Cecil County Buick event organized by Doug Downey and the Delaware and Maryland guys. They reported back that is an event the Chapter should participate in so since then are regulars at this Northeast Chapter organized event. This event cemented Doug's participation at many National as well as Regional Buick events, with the 65's debut at the 1992 event.



The 65 Gran Sport has had too many engines installed to count, with a turbo 400 admirably performing the chores before moving to a Powerglide. Car currently sports a Pee Gee Performance built Tomahawk block and is now a totally tube chassis car.



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
